## Success of our SCF

Comparing results for a six month period 1 November 2007 to 30 April 2008 to the latest six months 1 November to 30 April 2009 showed a 47,54% decline in priority crimes, eg. burglary at business and residential premises, theft of and out of motor vehicles and robbery with a firearm. The success can only be attributed to a closer working relationship with the SAPS through our SCF our active neighbourhood watch.

## Crime Alert

Police are looking for the following vehicles:  
MOUNT Croix crime forum representatives and police are looking for these vehicles which are suspected of being involved in criminal activity throughout the Port Elizabeth area.

### Vehicle 1:

An old Dark blue Toyota Corolla, CCH 587EC, which was seen at the scene of a burglary in Bowker Street, Mount Croix.

### Vehicle 2:

An old blue Citi Golf with white trim, BRK 108 EC. This vehicle normally has 3 men inside. These men are suspected of being behind a spate of house robberies all over Port Elizabeth.

If either of these vehicles are spotted please call the police immediately.

### Note from Atlas:

*Never approach the occupants of these vehicles if spotted. Report their location to the police immediately. If the vehicle is spotted parked and no occupants are inside, still inform the police so that they can take action.*

### REMEMBER TO REPORT

### ANY SUSPICIOUS BEHAVIOUR OR PERSONS TO THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH OR 10111

Not reporting a crime has a detrimental effect to policing in your area as manpower and resources needed to fight crime are allocated to the station according to the amount of crime reported in that area. Unfortunately only one in every four crimes is reported to police due to a failed faith in the criminal justice system. So much so that in an ordinary theft case it takes 8 months for a trial date to be set.

The knock on effect is simple; less reported crime results in less police resources given to your suburb.

For this reason it is vital all criminal activities are reported. It is imperative that a case docket gets opened!

Every time an incident is not registered, another criminal is set free to practice crime.

### Why you must open a criminal case:

- If an arrest is made and no case is registered, the suspect must be released and no record of the offence is kept.
- The statistics are needed for the police to determine crime patterns and redundancy within specific neighbourhoods, enabling them to deploy the correct amount of police officers to that area.
- The suspect that you have just released by not opening a case may be a criminal that the police are looking for. If you register a case the suspect is detained, their fingerprints are taken and through a fingerprint system they can be linked to various other outstanding crimes including murder
