Child suspected to be used in burglary

Walmer resident, Lesley, tells how she suspects a young child managed to squeeze through her homes burglar bars and gain entry into her house: "We live in Main Road Walmer. On 16/1/2010 we had someone access our house late at night (after 12) after we had all gone to bed. It must have been a child as the only way they could have got in is via one of the front windows facing the street-there are burglar bars but a child could have got in through one of the small panes.

Access via the back of the house is virtually impossible as two large dogs sleep right next to the back door and no windows were open and the sliding doors were locked. We leave a small paned window open in the front for our cats.

A cell phone and two pairs of trainers were stolen - all these items were in the entrance hall of our house. Strangely enough a handbag was left untouched as was my husband's wallet which was lying on top of a dresser. This further reinforced that this was probably a child as they would not have recognised the unusual shape of the handbag and the wallet was above a small child's eye level. We suspect that a recent contracted painter might have been involved as he is known to have peered in windows when he was working to suss the place out and he would also have noticed where the dogs slept and the fact that we left the front windows slightly open at night. He also did not turn up for work that Saturday but rather arrived 3 days later to borrow money with a small boy in tow!!

My husband had been parking his 4X4 in the yard in front of the lounge windows thereby providing cover for our thief. We suspect that someone might have been watching the house as the burglar knew exactly when to strike-does not look like an opportunistic crime. Our dogs also sleep at the back and would not have heard what was going on at the front. We have a dog warning on the gate but the burglar still came so this further indicates that he knew where the dogs would be at night and that they would be unlikely to hear him at the front.

The learning's from this experience were the following:

1. Burglar bars at small paned windows will not stop a child from getting in - close your windows at night.

2. Don't obscure the front of your windows by parking a vehicle in the front yard in front of your windows -provides cover for small burglars 3. Take wallets, handbags and cell phones to your bedroom at night-don't leave them in entrance halls-particularly in double story houses like ours. Install a security gate at the top of the stairs as a further precaution.

4. If you have a painter working at windows, close the curtains and the windows so he cannot see inside or see that access can be gained despite the burglar bars.

5. Possibly check out the street before you go to bed to check for loiterers. If they know that you have seen them this often discourages random burglaries.

FRAUD Alert warns internet users to beware of yet another fraudulent website looking to attain personal information. This method of fraud is called Phishing and usually aims to attain personal information such as credit card, bank account or other confidential information.

According to the alert service, the website, even though perceived to be legit, is fraudulent and aims at attaining personal information.

Internet users are drawn to the site by means of an e-mail with a deceptive subject line, forged senders addresses and disguised hyperlinks.

Fraud Alert also warns of genuine looking content which could fool most viewers.

Internet users are warned not to fill in the information form on the website as it is used to attain personal and sensitive information.

Warning received via e-mail

Over the weekend one of our teachers Desmond Ruddy was driving down Vitry Ave, Lorraine at about 10pm. He passed a car that did not have its lights on so he flicked his lights, as we all do, to tell the driver to turn on lights. This car then turned and chased him until they cornered him. He was pulled from the car and badly beaten up by a gang. His children were both in the car with him at the time. They fortunately were not harmed by this gang, but I am quite sure that they will need some sort of counselling to get over this trauma.

Please warn everyone not to flick their lights at other cars that don't have their's switched on. I have heard of this happening before but thought it was a hoax – obviously it is not.

WATER SHORTAGE – COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE REQUIRED

The Metro's water supply has reached a critical stage and serious savings are essential. Communities are not only encouraged to implement water savings at home but to also report any leaks or wastage of water in public areas to 0800205050 (Call free) or waterleaks@mandelametro.gov.za

Stringent control over water useage will become effective from Monday 01 February 2010. Households will be restricted to 500 litres per household. No Municipal water may be used for watering the garden or filling swimming pools from this date. All residents are requested to work together in saving water. Residential rate from 1 February 2010 up to 500 litres daily R5,80 per 1000 litre. (Any amount in excess will be R14.91 per 1000 litres)
